Giving Back....through the Giving Tree

Christmas is a time of wonderful traditions, and one of our favorites at St. Mark's is the Christmas "Giving Tree." This year once again our giving will focus on abused or neglected children and teens of Fort Bend County who currently are under the care of the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services.

Gifts from our "Giving Tree" will be taken to the Rainbow Room, an all-volunteer, charitable organization dedicated to helping Fort Bend infants, children and teens in crisis. In 2012, there were 2,558 reported cases of child abuse in Fort Bend County with 2,208 cases being assigned for investigation. All of these children are eligible for services in the Rainbow Room.
