

Godly Play Lesson – Sunday, April 5, 2020

This week's lesson is The Good Shepherd. Please read Luke 15:1-32 to familiarize yourself with the parable of the Good Shepherd. The children are familiar with the story of baby Jesus and his mother Mary and father Joseph. In the book of Luke Jesus is fully man and fully God. He travels from place to place teaching about God's kingdom through the use of parables. As with the other lessons, please access godlyplayfoundation.com and find "The story of the Good Shepherd." Watch several times with your child and use the suggested materials to tell the story. The wondering questions at the end help your child think about what we can learn from the story.

Key concepts: The Good Shepherd shows deep loving care for the sheep. He knows them by name, provides for them, and keeps them safe. The good shepherd searches for them when they're lost and is even willing to give his own life (Easter) for them.

Materials needed, cotton ball, construction paper to make sheep and googly eyes if available. Preschoolactivities.us gives suggestions on how to make worksheets and animal figures.
