OUR VISION

Yesterday, the pillars of St. Mark's had a vision for a church that exists for those who are not yet its members, and they acted upon that vision for our sake. Today, we are called to write the next chapter for our church growing in the grace that always precedes and follows us. Tomorrow, our future education and preschool building will support the ministries that shape us and the people and children led to be blessed by the mission and ministry of St. Mark's.

Our 2013 Operating Budget - \$245,000

Our operating budget supports the ongoing mission and ministry of St. Mark's. Over the past two years our operating budget has grown, to support the growing ministries of our parish. Our proposed budget for 2013 will be \$245,000, a 5% increase from last year's budget. As our ministries grow, we encourage each household to grow in its ministry of stewardship and prayerfully consider giving more toward the mission and ministry of St. Mark's.

Our Capital Vision - \$1,600,000

Christian Formation

Since the beginning of 2011, our Sunday morning Christian formation program has grown from one adult class to two adult classes, a youth class, a Godly Play class for children, and a nursery available for adults wishing to attend their respective classes. The second story of the new building will provide as many as six classrooms with the capability for wireless internet and today's technology.

Youth Ministry

One of the most obvious groups of growth in the church has been our youth. The second story of the building will provide a space designated for youth Christian Formation and FYC

Preschool & Nursery

The first floor of the building will accommodate six classrooms for a Monday through Friday preschool unique in offering a formative Episcopal éducation to the youth in our greater community. The first floor will also provide space for an infant nursery, a toddler nursery, and a Godly Play room to be utilized by the church on Sunday mornings.

Fellowship

An area for fellowship will connect the new building with our current building. The fellowship space will be at least 50% larger than our current hospitality room and provide a place for us to congregate before or after services and Sunday morning classes.

Liturgy & Worship

With an enlarged nursery in the new building, the current nursery will be renovated into a larger and more accommodating sacristy for the altar guild.

Administration

With a connection to those offices in our current building, a church library, a reception area, more office space, and a conference room will be provided on the second floor of the new building.

Our Parish Capital Goal - \$500,000

Through a generous dollar-for-dollar matching gift of up to \$500,000 from the legacy of Jackie and Dean Leaman, and \$400,000 in funds already secured from the sale of the old church building in Rosenberg, our capital goal for this campaign is \$500,000

Your prayerful support and commitment for this very important endeavor in the life of St. Mark's is crucial. Together, when we all contribute in this way, we the people of St. Mark's will continue Growing In Grace
