### Summer Camp Fun

Dear Parents,

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Thank you for registering for Summer Camp. We are pleased to offer you ten weeks of **Summer Camp Fun**. Each week there will be a different fun theme, with activities and projects relating to the theme. Please see the Registration (last page) for details on dates, costs, and themes.

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All camps are offered Monday through Friday and include lunch time with lunch provided from home. The first week of camp is June 4-8 and the last week is August 13-17. The school is closed the week of July 2-6 and there will be no camp that week. All weeks of camp, except the third week described below, are offered as Summer Camp Fun.

The third week of camp is Vacation Bible School which will feature a "Rolling River Rampage" theme. The school will pay the registration fee for VBS when students are attending camp.

- The children will gather in the School to participate in before camp activities.
- At 9:30 children aged 3 and above will be escorted to morning VBS, as presented by St. Mark's Episcopal Church. Teachers for this age group will remain with students during VBS.
- Children under 3 will remain with Staff assigned to the under 3 group in the school and follow the camp program as outlined below.
- All VBS fees will be paid by the school out of the tuition fee.
- Lunch for children aged 3 and above will be at 12:35 daily during the VBS week.
- After lunch, the students will have rest time and fun activities throughout the afternoon.
- For this week, if you are interested in **only** VBS (M-Th, 9:30-12:30), please contact St. Mark's Episcopal Church at 281-545-1661 for the registration form and fee.

**SMES Summer Camp – 9:00AM - 2:00PM:** The cost for each week of camp is as outlined below. The Camp program includes:

- Theme Based Camp activities, craft projects, activity centers, exploration, recess and more.
- Lunch at 12:00 followed by rest time and theme based afternoon enrichment activities.

**Before and After Care (BAC) – 7:15-9:00AM Before Care & 2:00-5:30PM After Care:** The cost for the BAC is \$25 per week. The BAC program includes:

- Pre- and/or post- camp activities,
- Camp activities, as listed above,
- Afternoon snack provided from home and theme based afternoon enrichment activities.
- The cost for each week of BAC is \$25.00.

To enroll your child, please fill out the attached Camp Registration Form and return the form to the office by with payment as outlined below:

• Signed up for less than 5 weeks of camp: Total Tuition and Fees due with registration form.

• Signed up for 5 or more weeks of camp: One-third of Total Tuition & Fees due with registration; One-third due by May 30 & Remaining balance due by June 20.

#### All Campers Need:

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- All campers require a ready to eat morning snack, and lunch, including a drink, provided from home each day.
- Children attending BAC-After Care also need a ready to eat afternoon snack.
- A cot will be assigned to each child for the summer. All children need a cot sheet (available at the front office for \$10.00) and a small blanket for rest time. Rest time materials must fit in a 2-gal Ziploc bag. Crib sheets and Nap Mats are not allowed. For safety concerns, pillows and stuffed animals are not allowed.
- We will be going outside every day, weather permitting. Sunscreen and bug spray, as appropriate for your child, should be applied at home each day. We will re-apply sunscreen and bug spray as provided by you, based on the signed permission slip included in your Camp registration packet. Please provide bug spray and sunscreen in a Ziploc bag with your child's name on the outside.
- Closed toe shoes are required for the playground. Sandals and flip-flops are not allowed.
- Children in diapers or pull-ups are required to provide all diaper and pull-up supplies from home, including baby wipes and diaper cream. Please label all supplies with child's name.
- All campers should provide a spare change of clothes, including socks, shoes, and underwear.
- Each camper should provide a box of tissues for school use.

**Emergency Permission Card** 

• Each week will include activities that incorporate science, math, language, art and music. **Fridays will be FUN DAYS!** On this day camp activities will focus on Sports, Splashes, Bubbles, Buckets, and MORE! Teachers will let parents know if students need, Swimsuits, Water Shoes, and Towels for Friday.

#### Descriptions of each Camp Week

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**Week One**: June 4 - June 8: Swashbucklers and Privateers! Look for lost treasure, dress like a swashbuckler! The games, story time, songs, finger plays, arts and crafts will focus on the swashbuckler and privateer theme.

Week Two: June 11 - June 15: Sound of Music!
Come along with us as we make musical instruments to make a classroom band. We will experiment with rhythm and movement through dance and songs.

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Week Three: June 18 - June 22: VBS Rolling River Rampage; STEM Water Activities: Join the water fun as we investigate sink and float; waves, ice, rainbows, bubbles, and the water cycle!

Week Four: June 25 - June 29: Hawaiian Adventure: Explore Hawaiian arts and crafts, games, songs, shells, leis, grass skirts and Hawaiian shirts!

**Week Five:** July 9 - July 13: Science Exploration: Discover matter, energy, and how things move.

Week Six: July 16 - July 20: Circus, Circus: Come to the Circus and discover the animals, people, and games found under the big top!

**Week Seven**: July 23 - July 27: Mother Goose: Learn rhymes, songs, finger plays, games, arts and crafts.

Week 8 July 30 - August 3 Critters in the Garden: Discover what critters are in the garden.

Week 9 August 6 - August 10 Put me in the Zoo: Colors and animals come alive in the book by Dr. Seuss.

Week 10 August 13 - August 17 - Prehistoric Journey

Dinosaurs and birds come together for this prehistoric adventure. We'll learn about giant lizards, feathered friends and look for clues to determine which creatures used to inhabit Texas and which still have modern-day relatives.
