St. Mark's Episcopal School Summer Camp Fun

Come and join us for **Summer Camp Fun!** The program will meet the needs of children from the ages of 18 months - 3 years (Not potty trained); 3 years to 5 years (potty trained); and Kindergarten to rising 1st grade students (students entering 1st grade for the 2022-23 school year). Each age group will be offered based on enrollment, and may be combined with another group when necessary. Ratios range between 1:4 and 1:10 based on the age of the group of children, in accordance with licensing. *The camp program is from 9am-2pm. Before & After* Care (BAC) is offered to enrolled campers from 7:00-9:00am Before Camp and After Camp from 2:00-5:30pm for an additional fee. (Please fill out one form per child.)

The Summer Camp Fun program will be offered in one week sessions for eleven weeks. Each week there will be a different fun theme, with activities and projects relating to the theme. The first week of camp is May 23-27 and the last week is August 8-12. All camps except the second week, May 30-June 3, are offered Monday through Friday and include lunch time with lunch provided from home. The second week of camp, May 30-June 3, is offered Tuesday through Friday as Monday, 5/30, is the Memorial Day Holiday. The school is closed the week of July 4-8 and there will be no camp that week. No refunds for non-attendance during the week.

All weeks of camp are offered as **Summer Camp Fun**. Each week there will be a Bible story. If St. Mark's Episcopal Church offers VBS during the time of our Summer Camp, the VBS activities will be incorporated into our program. Details of this change will be provided in advance.

SMES Summer Camp Fun – 9:00AM - 2:00PM: The theme for each week of camp is as outlined below. You may choose two, three of five days per week. The Camp program includes:

- Theme Based Camp activities, craft projects, activity centers, exploration, recess and more.
- Weekly Bible story with coloring page or craft.
- Lunch between 11:15 and 12:30, depending on the age of the class, followed by rest time.

Before and After Care (BAC) - 7:00-9:00AM Before Care & 2:00-5:30PM After Care: The cost for the BAC is \$35 per week per child. This program is offered to our students enrolled in the Summer Camp Fun program. The BAC program includes:

- Pre- and/or post- camp activities,
- Camp activities, as listed above,
- Afternoon snack provided from home and theme based afternoon enrichment activities.

For our summer session, it is required that all children four-years-old and older be completely potty trained. It is required that three-year-olds be potty trained or almost potty trained. If your three-year-old hasn't started potty training, now is the time.

To enroll your child, please fill out the attached Camp Registration Form and return the form to the office with payment as outlined below:

- Signed up for less than 5 weeks of camp: Total Tuition and Fees due with registration form.
- Signed up for 5 or more weeks of camp: One-third of Total Tuition & Fees due with registration; One-third due by June 1 & Remaining balance due by July 1.

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All Campers Need:

• All campers require a ready to eat morning snack, and lunch, including a drink, provided from home each day.

- Children attending BAC-After Care also need a ready to eat afternoon snack.
- A cot will be assigned to each child for the summer. All children need a cot sheet and a small blanket for rest time. (If you attended school this year, we will reuse your bedding from the end of school.) If you are new to St. Mark's, cot sheets are available at the front office for \$10.00 each, which is our cost. Rest time materials must fit in a 2-gal Ziploc bag. *Crib sheets and Nap Mats are not allowed. For safety concerns, pillows and stuffed animals are discouraged.*
- We will be going outside every day, weather permitting. Sunscreen and bug spray, as appropriate for your child, should be applied at home each day. We will re-apply sunscreen and bug spray as provided by you, based on the signed permission slip included in your Camp registration packet. Please provide bug spray and sunscreen in a Ziploc bag with your child's name on the outside.
- Closed toe shoes are required for the playground. Sandals and flip-flops are not allowed.
- Children in diapers or pull-ups are required to provide all diaper and pull-up supplies from home, including baby wipes and diaper cream. Please label all supplies with child's name.
- All campers should provide a spare change of clothes, including socks, shoes, and underwear.
- Each camper should provide a box of tissues and a box of gallon Ziploc bags for school use.
- Each week will include activities that incorporate science, math, language, art and music.

If you are currently registered at St. Mark's School we will use the information on file. Please update any information as needed for summer.

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Descriptions of each Camp Week

Week One: May 23 - May 27: Old MacDonald: We will be singing Old MacDonald and learning about farms, farmers and farm animals all week long.

Week Two (Tuesday-Friday): May 30 - June 3: Kaleidoscope of Colors: We will learn about mixing two colors to get an entirely different color. All week, we will be making colorful crafts and reading color filled books.

Week Three: June 6 - June 10: How Does it Go? (STEM Transportation): Does it have wheels? Does it have wings? Does it move through the air? Does it move on the water? These are the questions we will be asking and answering as we explore all sorts of machines and how they move.

Week Four: June 13 - June 17: Out of this World!: We will be exploring things beyond the earth this week. Stars, planets and moons that fill our skies will be discussed. What's that? Is it a space ship? You will have to come this week to find out.

Week Five: June 20 - June 24: Our Feathered Friends: We will learn about colorful birds from different parts of the world. We will learn about what they eat, what size their eggs are, how they nest, if they fly and other interesting facts.

Week Six: June 27 - July 1: Let's Make Music: Campers will explore the world of instruments, rhythm, and songs. We will make creative instruments, sing happy songs and dance to the music, too.

July 4 - July 8: No Camp - School is Closed

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Week Seven: July 11 - July 15: American Authors: We will learn about the authors that wrote some of our favorite books. Authors featured will be Eric Carle, Maurice Sendak (Where the Wild Thingds Are), Dr. Seuss and Dean/Litwin (Pete the Cat books). On each day we will explore books by the featured author of the day and make a related craft.

Week Eight: July 18 - July 22: Aloha, Hawaii (Our 50th State): Campers will learn about coconuts, pineapples, leis, surfboards and more as we travel to Hawaii for the week. Did you know that Aloha means hello and goodbye in our 50th state?

Week Nine: July 25 - July 29: Mother Goose on the Loose: It is all things Mother Goose and make believe this week! We will have lots of fun learning nursery rhymes and silly songs. Be sure to bring your imagination this week.

Week Ten: August 1 - August 5: Fast/Slow, Stop/Go - It's Opposites Week: Is it night or day, fast or slow, up or down? These are just some of the opposites we will be learning about & exploring this week.

Week Eleven: August 8 - August 12: Taste of the World: This week we will learn about different foods and where they come from. We will travel to each country as we explore the local cuisine. Be sure to bring your passport!

August 15 - August 19: No Camp - Staff In-Service Week. This is based on our first day and the first day of school for LCISD being August 22.
